Submit your application to school's Scholarship Committee and attach the following documents in the order listed:

- **cover letter** stating why you are a suitable candidate.
- **application form** (or a computer-generated replica allowing you more space to respond)
- **statement** explaining your need for financial assistance - Burnaby South War Memorial Bursary only.
- **resume** - these awards emphasize service to the school and community so focus on these areas in your resume.
- **copy** of both your **grade 11 & 12 transcripts**.
- **MINIMUM of two reference letters** that support your community and school service. This is a crucial part of your application and **MUST** be included. If you state volunteer activities in your application, make every effort to include some documentation in the form of a letter, certificate, etc. to provide evidence of your involvement as well as the duration of your involvement.
