- 3. Private Organizations

## 1. Ministry of Education

**BC Ministry Scholarship Link** 

- A. Dogwood/District Authority Scholarships -\$1250 (info released in May 2021)
- B. BC Excellence Scholarship \$5000(due date info released in January/February)
- C. BC Achievement Scholarship \$1250(Ministry decides in Fall 2021)
- A. Pathway to Teacher Education School \$5000 (due date info released in January/February)

### A. Dogwood Scholarships - \$1250

 Applied Skills, Fine Arts, Community Service, Physical Activity, Languages, Tech and Trades, Indigenous Language and Culture

#### Requirements

- Application required
- Concentration of 4 courses leading to a career in that area
- At least C+ (2.5 GPA)
- Good attendance and attitude
- Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident
- 25 grads at Byrne were awarded this last year (must graduate to receive this)

### B. BC Excellence Scholarship-\$5000

- Recognizes 55 students in BC for excellence in community service in and out of school
  - Shows commitment to their chosen career

#### Requirements:

- School must nominate student
- Application required
- Canadian Citizen or Landed Immigrant
- BC resident
- B average; C+ average in certain courses
- Complete resume
- Two references

### C. BC Achievement Scholarships - \$1250

 Recognizes 3000 BC Grads with highest cumulative average requirements based on courses required for graduation from grades 10-12

#### Requirements:

- No application required. Ministry will determine recipients based on marks
- At least 73% in English 12 or Communications 12
- Canadian Citizen or Landed Immigrant
- BC Resident

## D. Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship - \$5000

- Recognizes 20 Grads who want to be a teacher
- Requirements:
  - Application required
  - Must who evidence of commitment to and aptitude for a teaching career
  - Maintain B average in all courses with no more than one grade 12 course at the C+ level
  - Resume
  - Two reference letters

BC Achievement	\$1250	No	None	Ministry	October
Pathway to Education	\$5000	Yes	Student applies to Ministry	Ministry Committee	September

#### 2. Sponsored by Post-Secondary Institutions

#### **Scholarships**

- Most are due in February
- Mostly based on marks
- Major awards often require "other" involvement
- Student writes academic and personal profile

#### **Bursaries**

- Must demonstrate financial need
- Need must be above and beyond "ordinary"









## 3. Sponsored by Private Organizations

- Community involvement
- Interests or skills
- See our website for updates
  - Ex. Horatio Alger, TD Canada Trust, Remax Quest for Excellence, AES...

- Contact your consulate if your family is not from Canada
- Ask your parents' place of work

## 4. Sponsored by Byrne Creek

- Provided by donations
- Set up for various reasons by departments and community partners
  - Ex. Artona, Corporate Classics etc.)
- Thousands of dollars are available in this category
  - Example: PAC, Leo Club, Student Government, Athlete of the Year, Byrne Creek Alumni, VPA, Department awards...
  - Amounts usually range from \$100-\$500 each

### Reference Letters

- Very important that the letter indicates
  - SPECIFICS of what you did
  - How often you volunteered/worked
  - Number of hours you contributed



- Provide your referee with a summary of your commitments
  - Template is provided for you
  - Click on SCHOLARSHIP FORMS, then REFERENCE LETTER FORMS
- Give your referee 2 weeks to write a **good** letter for you
- Be sure to write a thank you card for people who write your letter(s)

## **External Applications**



- Follow the instructions on the application
- You are responsible for gathering info
- You are responsible for meeting the due date
- You are responsible for mailing the application
- Send the applications <u>before</u> the deadline.
   They will <u>not</u> look at your application if it arrives after the due date.

## The Byrne Creek Scholarship Committee will look closely at your:

- Personal profile
- Extracurricular involvement in and out of school
- Financial need
- Marks from grades 10-12
- Special circumstances
- Reference letters

## The reasons to apply:



- Get a head start on paying for your tuition
- There are **millions** of dollars out there for scholarships... you just have to look for it
- Scholarships exist for every kind of student from Academics, Trades, the Arts, Applied Skills to Physical Education and more
- Most scholarships focus volunteerism outside of the classroom rather than grades
- They are focused on students who are contributing to their community and authentically learning from their activities
  - Not just "checking the box"

## The applications are a great self-reflection activity:

- 3000
- Self reflections are an important part of your growth
  - You have probably done these kinds of reflections in your classes
  - Keep your responses and use them in your applications
- They ask about the most significant things you have learned in your life
- They get you to think about what is most important to you
- They get you to think about what you want... not just what career you think you want to do
- The applications encourage you to pause and reflect on your life
