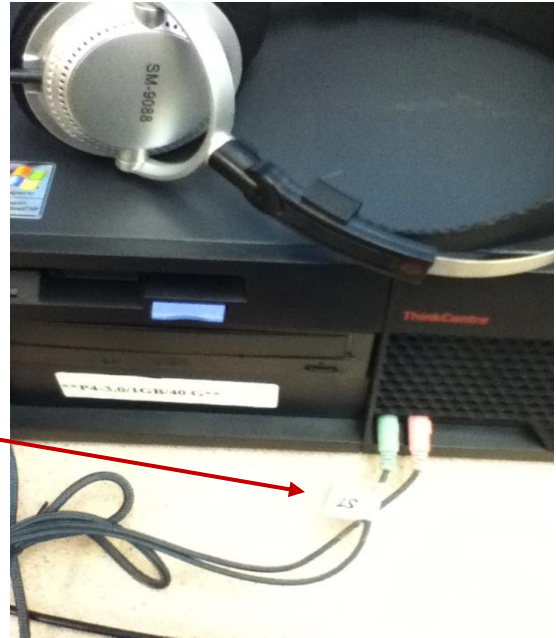


Intervention with Y-Jacks/Headsets

Using a Y-Jack or an audio splitter is an intervention support for both student and teacher.

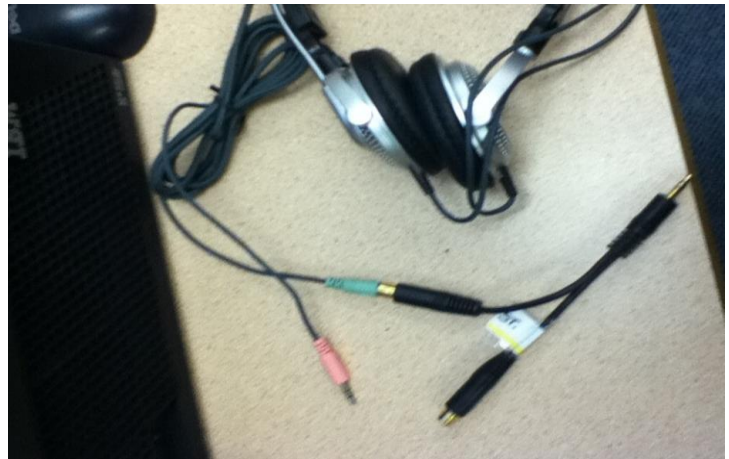
Student Headset:

- To identify which end to pull from the computer, consider labelling the sound end of the student headset.



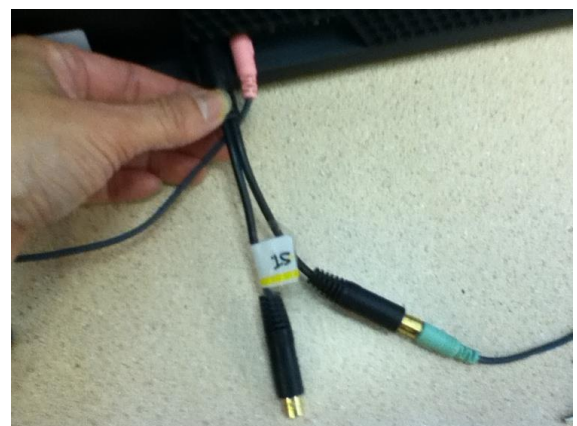
Teacher Headset:

- Attach one end of the 'Y' portion of the Y-Jack to the teacher headset. Leave the pink mic end free.
- Label the other end of the 'Y' portion as the 'student end'.



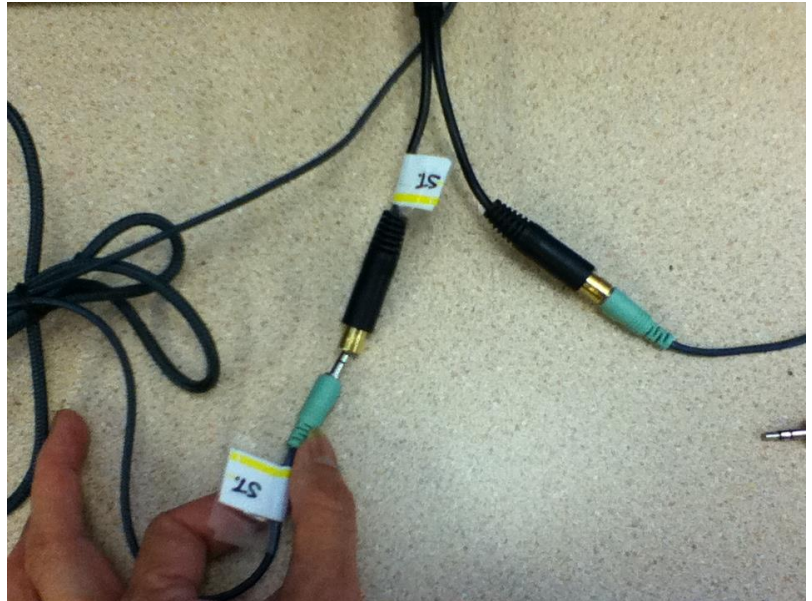
When you need to do a **paired listening intervention**, you will do 2 things:

- Ask the student to stop, while you connect.
- Pull the student (green/black) headset end from the computer speaker port.
- On the teacher headset with the attached Y-Jack, insert the single end into the computer speaker.



Student Headset:

- Take the Student headset loose end [green/black] and insert it in the open 'y' end (labelled STUDENT).
- *NOTE: the student [pink] mic end remains in the computer port.



You should both be able to hear from both left/right ear pieces.

*NOTE: the Teacher [pink] mic end remains loose.
