Referencing Images

It is very important that when using images, clipart, diagrams, photographs, etc. off the internet that they too are referenced. You can do this in two ways:

(1) Referencing the source as a caption underneath the image:

(2) Including them on the references sheet with your books, websites, videos, etc.

Last name, Initial of the artist, photographer, company. (Date). *Title of the work or description*. [Image]. Retrieved from (web address)

Example for the photo above:

There are free picture websites that can be very useful; however, you still need to reference any images you use from these sites as well! Below are a few sites to check out. They are also listed on the library blog.


