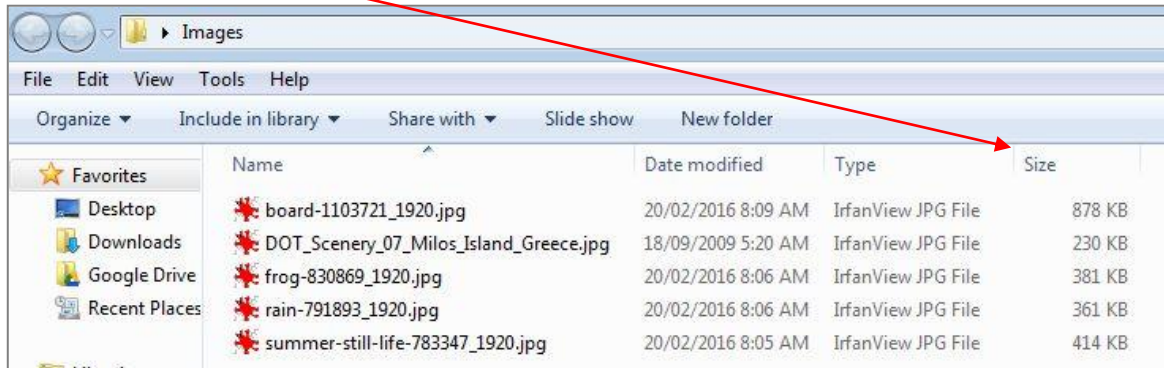


IRFANVIEW 4.35 – Batch Processing of Images

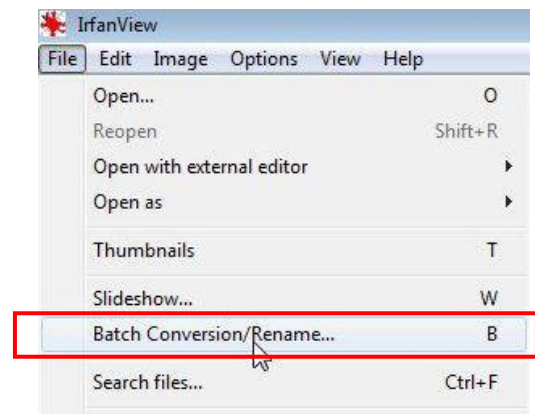
It is easier to place all the images you wish to convert in one folder. In this example, I have 5 images (note the SIZE).



1. Create a folder on your desktop (or another location) to save your edited images.

2. Launch IrfanView

3. Select Batch Conversion

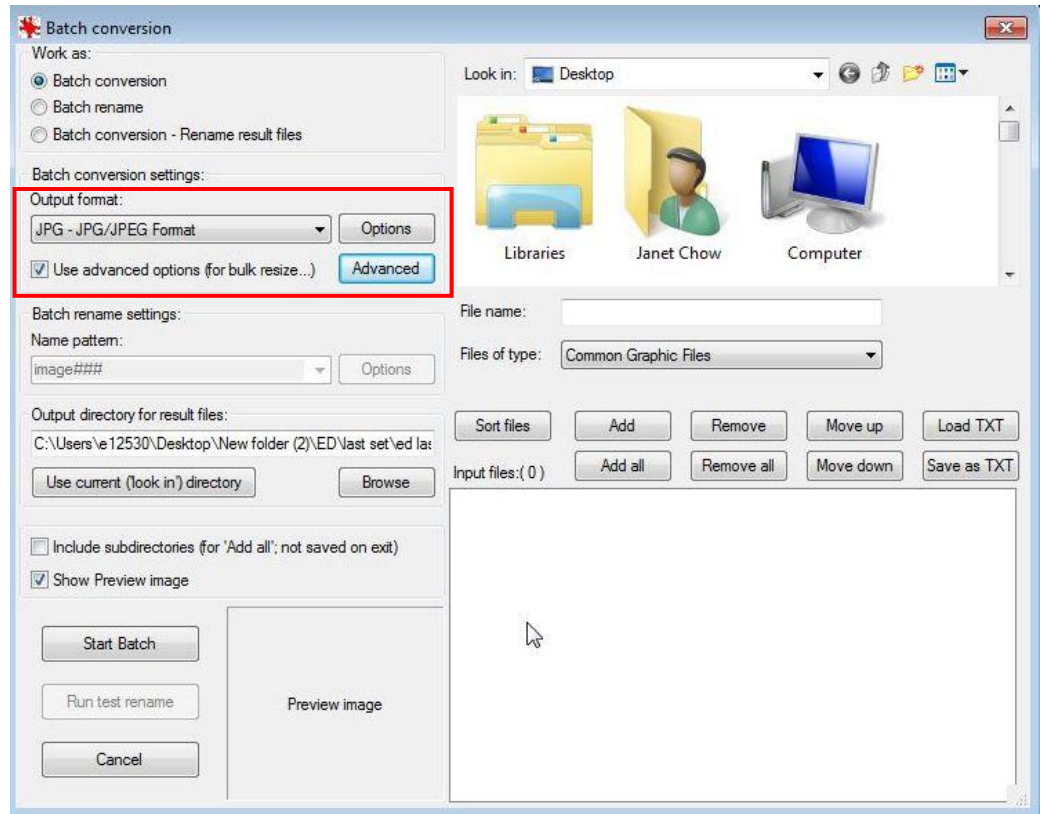


4. Batch conversion settings:

Output format:
JPG is the default

Use Advanced
Options – check

Click **Advanced**



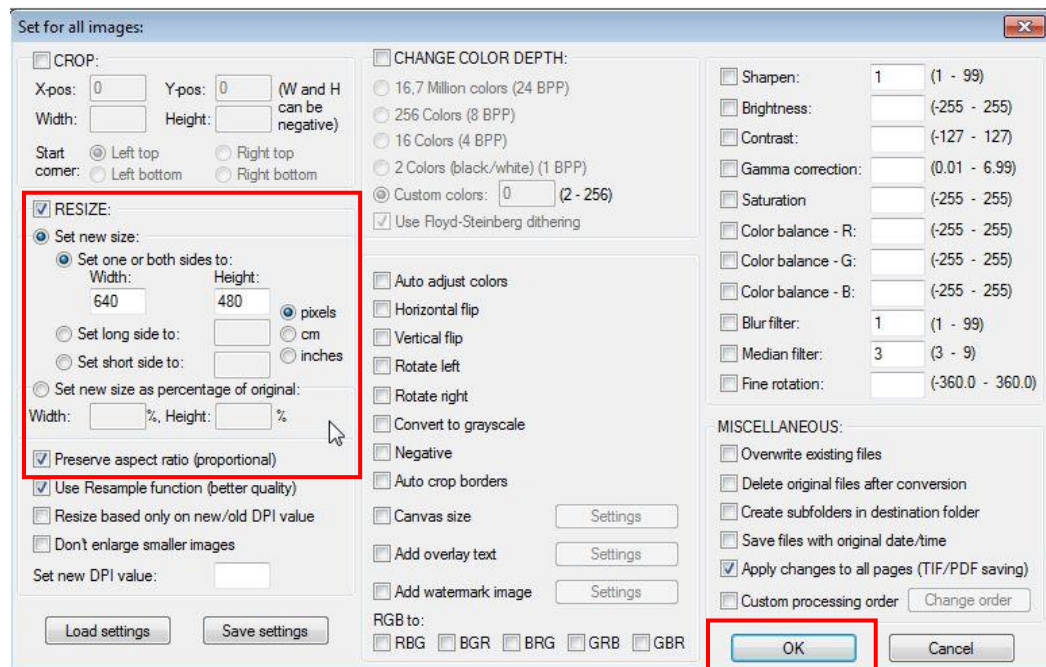
RESIZE – check

You can set a
width/height
(640 x 480 is a
usual size for web
images)

OR choose **Set
new size as
percentage of
original** (this
allows a more
finite resizing).

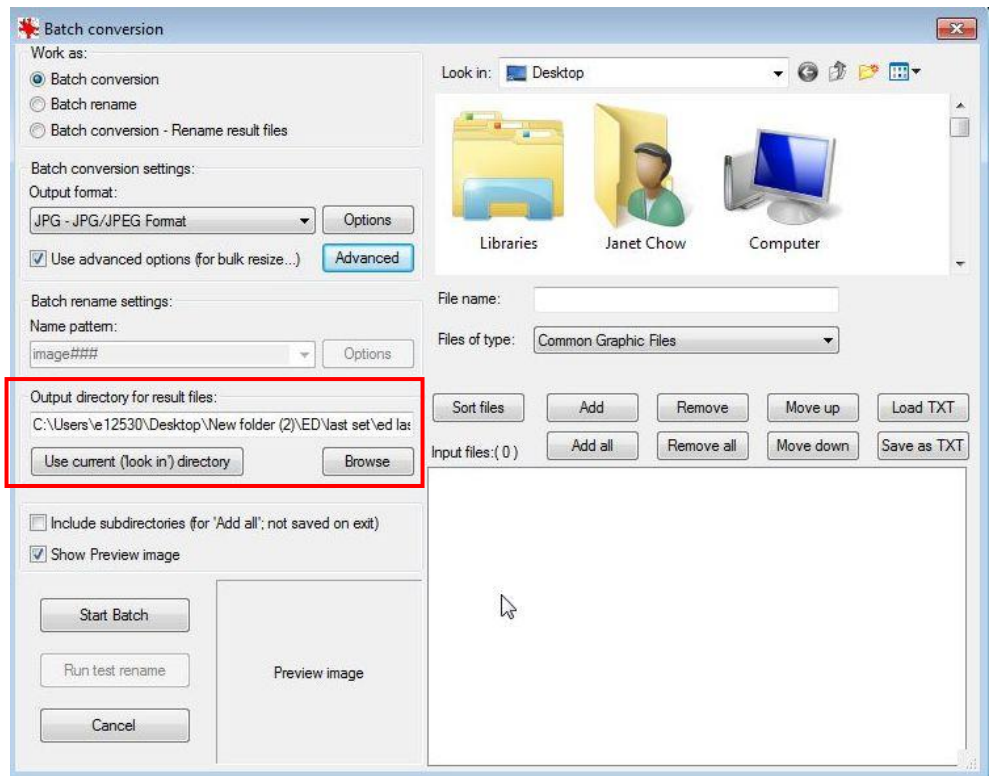
**Preserve aspect
ratio** - check

Click **OK**



Output directory for result files:

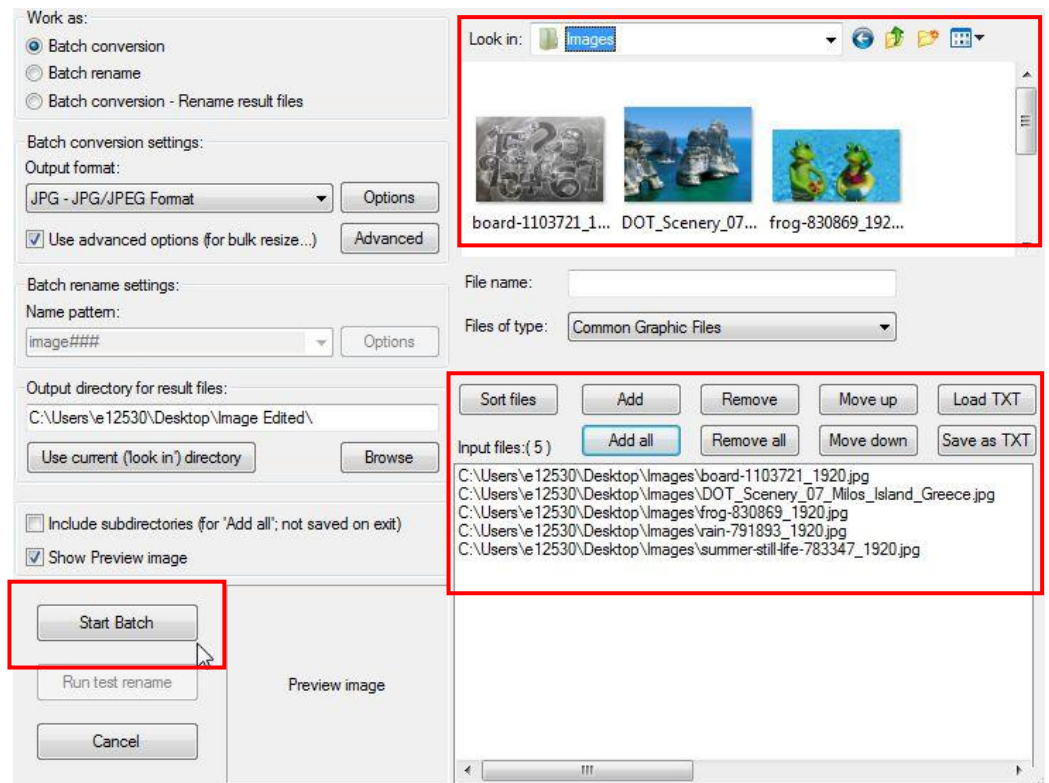
Browse for the folder you wish to put your resized images. (This was the one you created in Step 1.)

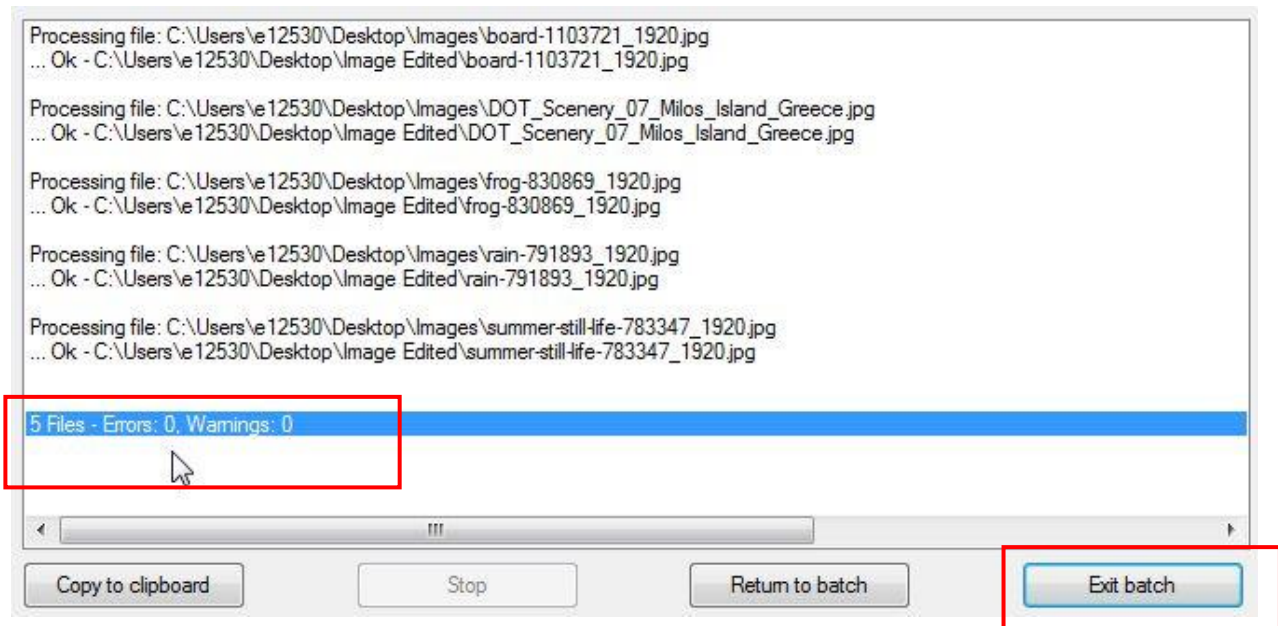


On the right side of the screen, **Look in:** (locate your original images. These will display in the box.)

Click **Add all** to place all the images in the **Input files box**

Click **Start Batch**





Your result should look like this with total number of Files and no errors.

Click **Exit batch**
