Circle Loom Knitting

Knitting is a technique for producing a two-dimensional fabric made from a one-dimensional yarn or thread. In weaving, threads are always straight, running parallel either lengthwise (warp threads) or crosswise (weft threads). By contrast,

the yarn in knitted fabrics follows a meandering path (a course), forming symmetric loops (also called bights) symmetrically above and below the mean path of the yarn.

Yes, we're working with patterns again!

The true magic is in the story that unfolds as the knitter weaves their yarn into patterns.



Start with the Basics:

Create a hat using the circle loom (36 peg – adult size).

First wrap the loom using an "e-wrap" process (going behind the peg and

wrapping the yarn around the peg).

Using the pick tool, take the bottom loop and raise over the top loop.

Creating a brim will give the hat structure. Decide on the length of the brim and double the rows so you can wrap it over top. (5 cm is a good length).

Think About: What story will you tell with your hat?
