Word Work - Literacy Station Ideas

Mix & Fix

-Use letters to mix sight words and fix them with a partner.

White Boards

-Use dry erase markers to write sight words on white boards.

Rainbow Write

-There are many prompts like this on Teachers Pay Teachers

- have students write sight words with fun mediums such as markers, highlighters, etc.

Fancy Fingers

-Have students practice sight words by making them fancy with dots, curvy lines, colors, etc.

Say, Build, Write

-There are many of these on TpT and Pinterest. Have word cards, build with magnetic letters, and write the word.

Magnetic Letters

-Use magnet letters to build words.

Stamping

-Use letter stamps to stamp words.

Sight Word Sentence

-Have students write sentences using sight words.

Word Sort

-Sort word family words.

Play-Doh

-Use play-doh to roll letters or stamp letters

Sight Word Games

-Play any number of sight word games!

Tic - Tac - Toe

-Play sight word tic-tac-toe by placeing sight words on a tic-tac-toe sheet. Read and then mark either an "x" or "o."

Kaboom!

This is a generic term for all games where you pull a card from a basket, if you read it, you keep it. If you get "kaboom" you put all your cards back.

Games

Play ANY sight word, ABC, or CVC game!

Work on Writing - Literacy Station Ideas

Alphabet Tracing

-Have students trace the alphabet or practice tracing single letters.

Alphabet Writing

-Have students practice writing the alphabet or practice single letters.

Name Writing

-Have students practice writing their name.

Sentence Structure

-Have students practice writing neat sentences that have a capital first letter, spaces, words, and punctuation.

Sight Word Sentence

-Create sentences using sight words.

Monthly Journal

-Use a monthly journal pack for students to write in.

Write the Room

Have the students write the room. There are many packs at different levels: ABC, Digraphs, Theme, Sentences, etc.

Think Draw Write

-Have students think of a story, draw the story, and write words to match.

Procedural Writing

-Have students write "How-To" instructional pieces. Ex. How to make a PB&J Sandwich

Informative Writing

-Have students write "All-About" pieces. Ex. All About Penguins

Personal Narrative

-Have students write a true story about themselves.

Story Writing

-Have students write any type of story

Theme Writing

-Use any thematic prompts with students.

Free Write

-Have students write poems, thoughts, or any choice!

Letter/Note

-Write a letter or note to someone.

<u>Labeling</u>

-Label a picture or draw a picture and add own labels.

<u>List</u>

-Use picture cards to make a list of items.

Write and Wipe

-Use a laminated page, preferably with a picture prompt to write a story and simply wipe it when done.

Notebook Writing

-Write in a notebook about any topic or prompt.

Read to Self - Literacy Station Ideas

Leveled Text Books

-Choose leveled texts for your students to read, preferably books they have been practicing or introduced to at Guided Reading.

3 Ways to Read a Book

- -Look at the Pictures
- -Look at the Words
- -Retell the Story

Classroom Library

-Have students choose books of interest from the classroom library.

Character Buddies

-Use stuffed animals as reading buddies for the students to choose from.

Reader Response

-Have students respond to their reading with a response form.

Whisper Phones

-Use whisper phones so students can hear their reading voices.

EEKK

-Students sit "Elbow, Elbow, Knee to Knee"

Read Same Text Together

Read the same book together and help each other.

Read to Partner

Take turns reading practiced books to a partner.
