Inventor and politician, William Peyton Hubbard was first a baker, invented a patented oven. Later, he went on to serve in municipal office in Toronto establishing public power systems.

Dr. Lisa Robinson



Dr Lisa Robinson is a renowned researcher in the study of kidney disease at Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto. She is also a Vice-Dean at the U of T Medical Faculty, and she is a Tier 1 Canada Research Chair.

Dr Rhonda McEwen



Dr. McEwen combines communication studies and behavioral sciences to examine the social and cognitive effects of technologies. Her research uses experimental techniques, eye tracking, observations, sensor to investigate Human-Machine Communication
