SFU Soccer Clinic

2012-2013



Simon Fraser University, in partnership with the *Burnaby School District*, is now accepting applications for this unique, one of a kind sport clinic for September 2012.

The *SFU Soccer Clinic* will be in its fourth year of operation and offering grade 8-12 male and female participants, high performance soccer training in a University environment, while fulfilling the academic requirements of two secondary school classes.

Young soccer players will have the opportunity to complete their academic and elective requirements at one of the Burnaby Secondary Schools during the regular academic day. Clinic participants will participate in two Soccer classes, every other day from 8:40 – 11:15. (I.e. Tues/Thurs week one, and M/W/F week two, of a two-week class rotation).

The emphasis is to develop the ‘complete’ Student-Athlete, with focus on both the athletic and academic development of each participant.

CLINIC INFO

OVERVIEW:

The SFU Soccer Clinic is a cooperative venture between the Simon Fraser University Athletics Department and the Burnaby School District. The delivery of this sport program will be under the supervision of varsity head soccer coach (Alan Koch) and will be geared towards the development of high performance athletes.

The clinic will occur at the Simon Fraser University Burnaby campus atop Burnaby Mountain.



FAQs:

• **Do clinic participants need to be attending a Burnaby secondary school?**

Yes: while this is not a requirement at the time of registration, in order to receive full credit in the Clinic, the participant will need to be enrolled and attending a Burnaby secondary school.

• **Which secondary schools within the Burnaby School District are involved in the partnership?**

Alpha, Burnaby North, Burnaby Mountain, Burnaby Central, Burnaby South, Moscrop & *Cariboo Hill (*offers French Immersion).

• **What is the Clinic capacity?**

There will be maximum coach to player ratio of 1:10, with up to 30 participants in total. Participants will be divided into groups each day based on ability, performance, work rate, professionalism, and leadership.



CLINIC CONTENT:

Soccer Clinic classes will consist of on-field soccer technical skill development; complemented by speed, strength and power training sessions, yoga, Pilates, as well as classroom instruction in areas such as game analysis, nutrition, sport psychology and other areas relating to the science of sport and training as applied to the sport of soccer.

PROGRAM LEADER:

SFU Men's Soccer Head Coach - Alan Koch

Coach Koch oversees all aspects of the clinic's operation and is regularly involved in the delivery of instruction. A native of South Africa, he has represented his country and played professionally in South Africa, Ireland, and Germany.

Over the course of the last 41 years, the SFU Men's Soccer Program has grown into one of North America's most successful university programs. Most recently, it won the conference title for SFU (2nd year in a row) as the first non-American school to be a member of the NCAA – division II. Prior to this, the program qualified for 23 NAIA National Championships and won the National Title on 3 occasions. Over the years more than 50 SFU players have gone on to play professionally in North America and in Europe, and over 40 have represented Canada at varying levels (youth, Olympic, World Cup). In addition, over 40 SFU soccer players have been honoured as All-Americans and Academic All-Americans.
