## Course Selection

> Your Course Selection Sheet is a contract between YOU \& Burnaby South
> All schools are staffed and timetabled based on how YOU complete YOUR Course Selection right NOW
> Only those courses with a sufficient number of students registered (by April 2021) will be able to be offered and run for September 2021
> Class that have too few students who selected them will have to be cancelled for the 2021-22 school year
> This may occur after Course Verification Sheets are sent out in May, so it's very important to have alternate choices for your electives "just in case"

## Course Selection

$>$ Sometimes it is $\underline{\text { NOT }}$ possible for us to give you your $1^{\text {st }}$ Choices $\rightarrow$ usually in your electives
$>$ That's why we need to know what else you might want to take
$>$ By picking an "alternate" the computer knows what other courses you are interested in to try and fit in your timetable
$>$ YES, there is always a possibility an alternate course will be in your timetable, so $\qquad$ pick WISELY!!
> If you pick the course (regular or alternate), and you get it in your timetable, you will be required to stay in it

- NOTE: It will NOT be a Timetable Error in September


## Course Selection

> ALL Burnaby South Students are required to take 8 Courses INSIDE the Timetable
> ONLY Students with incomplete Timetables or legitimate errors will be approved for a Course Correction in September 2021
> Legitimate Errors For Example Are:
> You have already completed the course you are enrolled in > ie: you completed a course in Summer School (SS 11, English Studies 12)
$>$ You require the course for University Admissions
> ie: Pre-Calculus 11 or Chemistry 11

## Course Selection

$>$ What is NOT considered a Legitimate Error?
> Not "liking" your course you're enrolled in
> Not having any friends in your class
> Not liking the time of day the class is in your timetable
> You want to have a specific teacher
> You change your mind
> MAKE YOUR CHOICES CAREFULLY!!
> Remember: There will be NO Course Changes in September

## What Are Honours Courses?

> Honours courses are offered in Grades 8 to 11
$>$ Benefits of Honours courses:

* Intended for advanced and motivated students who wish to study in an enriched learning environment
Study a subject at a greater depth with equally interested students
* Find out what you can really do $\rightarrow$ challenge yourself
* Honours Courses prepare students for AP Courses


## What Are AP Courses?

$>$ AP Stands for Advanced Placement
> AP Courses are University Level Courses and Exams offered at the High School Level

* We teach the University-level courses here
* Students write the end-of course AP Exam externally developed $\&$ scored by university \& AP teachers
* Exams are scored on a scale of 1 to 5
* Advanced Standing granted at Canadian Universities for those who score a 4 or 5 on the AP Exam
* Some American Universities will give advanced standing for a score of 3

> Benefits of AP Courses and the AP Exam:

* Stand out in your post-secondary admissions applications
$\star$ Recognized by universities in more than 60 countries for admission
* Earn post-secondary education course credit
* Build and learn post-secondary skills while still in high school

## AP Macroeconomics

MATHEMATICS


- AP Statistics can be taken at any time after a student has completed Foundations Pre-Calculus 10/11H
- AP Calculus should be taken in the Grade 12 year
- Calculus $A B$ is a one block course covering $1 / 2$ of $1^{\text {st }}$ year university math.
- Calculus BC is a two block course covering all of $1^{\text {st }}$ year university math


## How to Apply for Honours Courses

$>$ Minimum Requirements:
$>$ Subject minimum percentage is an $A / B$
> Work Habit should be GOOD in the subject area
$>$ Select ALL of the AP/Honours Courses you want to apply for in your MyEd Student Portal
$>$ VERY IMPORTANT: You MUST choose your AP/Honours Courses NOW
> It is TOO LATE to apply for an AP/Honours Course during Course Verifications in the Spring

## How to Apply for Honours/AP Courses

$>$ YES! You still must apply for an AP/Honours even if you are currently in an Honours Class
-Admission is based on Quarter Grades + Work Habits
$\Rightarrow$ After Course Selections are completed, Teachers in each Department will discuss who should be placed into each of the Honours/AP classes
>Students who do NOT get placed into an Honours/AP class will be placed onto a Waitlist for September

## Work Experience - Options

$>30$ Hours of Work Experience is a requirement for Graduation
> This is so you can gain employability skills and experience
$>$ Students can choose 3 options for Work Experience
> 30 Hours of Work Experience
> Mandatory for Graduation
$>80$ Hours of Work Experience
$>80$ Hours of Volunteer Work experience related to your career goals
$>4$ credits towards Graduation
> A "Study Block" in Grade 12
> Complete a written assignment
$>$ Youth Train-in-Trades Programs
> Combination of Course Work \& Hands-On Work Experience

## Work Experience - 8o Hours

> Earn 4 Grade 12 Elective Credits $\rightarrow$ Can count as a course in Grade 12
> 80 Hours of career-related Work Experience
> Satisfies the required 30 hours of Work Experience for Career Life Connections
> Can be completed between the Summer of Grade 10 and May of Grade 12 year
> Can be completed during or outside of school time
> Allows for career exploration in 1 or 2 focus areas of interest
> Helps to develop confidence in the workplace, references and experience for resumes and possible job contacts
> MUST complete an Employability Skills Profile
> A useful tool for interviews and for the Career Life Connections student-led exit interview in Grade 12
> When you chose 80 Hours of Work Experience, you need to choose a "FOCUS AREA"
> Ex: Business, Health, Trades, Science

Graduation Transitions 12
Graduation Transitions 12 is a mandatory requirement for graduation. Students must complete ALL 4 components to successfully eam Graduation Transitions 12 credits. Graduation Transitions requires students to explore personal and carreer goals during their secondary school years and create a plan for life after graduation. Transitions planning is an ongoing process throughout the graduation program years and requires the completion of a transition plan, culminating in a final Grade 12 student-led interview.

## > Are you interested in training in Volleyball or Lacrosse while taking High School Classes?

> Burnaby has partnered with SFU Athletics $\&$ Volleyball Canada to offer 2 specialized Academies to our Burnaby Students
> Students interested in an Athletic Academy will attend 2 classes offsite, where they will receive classes consisting of skill development, weight training and nutritional and mental preparation

There are 2 Different Programs open for Grade 11 \& 12 Students:
> Volleyball Academy

> Students can choose from 2 pathways: Academy Stream or Elite Stream
> Students participate for $2-3$ sessions/week (1.5/2hrs per session) at Cariboo Hill for 36 weeks
> Students receive credit for PE and a sport specific course
> FEE: $\$ 235 /$ month for 10 Months ( $\$ 2350$ for the year)
> Lacrosse Academy
> Supervised by SFU Lacrosse Head Coach

> Students attend 2 lacrosse classes every other day in the morning based on a two-week class rotation schedule (Week 1: Tue/Thurs and Week 2: Mon/Wed/Fri) at SFU Burnaby Campus
> Students receive credit for PE and a sport specific course
$>$ FEE: $\$ 235 /$ month for 10 Months ( $\$ 2350$ for the year)

> Youth Leadership
> Sports (Provincial Rep Teams, BC Summer Games, National Team Level)
> Coaching
> First Aid/Lifesaving
> ICBC Driver Training
> Computer Certification
> Scouts/Guides

## Post-Secondary Timeline Tips

1. STAGE 1: EARLY YEARS - Early Financial Planning
$\checkmark$ A 4-year degree can cost up to $\$ 70,000-$ in the US, you can multiply that by $4 x$
$\checkmark$ Look at saving for Post-Secondary - start up a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA) for the educational costs you will be facing after High School
2. STAGE 2: GRADES 8-10-Academic Awareness
$\checkmark$ You should be having conversations with your parents about specific courses you may want to take in Grade 11 \& 12

- Are you wanting to try an Honours or AP Course?
- Post-Secondary Institutions are beginning to look at "rigor" of course work for admissions
$\checkmark$ Be aware of Grades
- Universities are beginning to move away from simply looking at JUST grades, and looking at a students entire transcript

## 3. STAGE 3: GRADES 11 \& 12-Getting Ready

$\checkmark$ Start researching Scholarships, Awards \& Financial Aid Options

- There are scholarships available for students in Grade 10 \& 11
$\checkmark$ Career Life Connections 11 Course
- This course will happen during Collaboration each Term
- You will continue to do post-secondary research within this course
$\checkmark$ Set goals for making decisions - share these with your parents!!
- By Spring of Grade 11, I will have learned about 3 different programs that I am interested in
- By Spring of Grade 11, I will have researched 5 Post-Secondary Institutions that have the program that I am interested in
$\checkmark$ Start investigating specific Post-Secondary options with
- Particular Post-Secondary schools \& Programs available
- Attend Post-Secondary Institutions Presentations at Burnaby South - Oct to Nov

BC University Entrance Requirements
$>$ Each University \& Faculty has specific requirements
> Generally, you will need to take English 12 PLUS 3 to 4 other AP/Core Academic Grade 12 Courses (depending on which Post-Secondary you want to apply to)
> To keep ALL of your doors open, you will want to take the following:
$>$ Pre-Calculus 11 \& 12, Chemistry 11 \& 12, Physics 11 \& 12
> NOTE: Science \& Business Post-Secondary Advice
> HIGHLY recommended that you take Calculus 12 or AP Calculus 12
> $1^{\text {st }}$ year University Students in these faculties are required to take a Calculus Course in University
> ALSO - University of Toronto REQUIRES it for Admissions
> NOTE: Business Post-Secondary Advice
> Business programs in University are VERY competitive and often look at "well rounded" students, so think about the following courses:
> AP Microeconomics, AP Macroeconomics, AP Statistics, Financial Accounting 12, Economics 12, Marketing \& Promotions 11, E-Commerce (Marketing) 12

## Admissions Updates: SFU \& UBC

> UBC has changed how they are evaluating student applications
> No matter what Degree students are applying to, UBC will now broadly evaluate academic history, by looking at ALL Academic Grade 11 AND Grade 12 Courses
$>$ UBC will exclude the course with the lowest grade $\rightarrow$ UNLESS it is not a requirement of the faculty you are applying to (ie; English Studies 12, Pre-Calc 12)
$>$ UBC will also look at individual grade in KEY COURSES $\rightarrow$ so you MUST have strong grades in these courses (ie: English Studies 12, Pre-Calculus 12)
$>$ Each Faculty has their own Degree-Specific requirements - check UBC website for details
$>$ SFU has changed how they will be evaluating student applications
$>$ All applicants must present a minimum of 5 approved Grade 12 courses (including English 12)
$>$ Each Faculty has a list of courses ("List A" \& "List B") which will list specific courses required for their faculty - check SFU website for details
$>$ NOTE: If you are applying to multiple programs, YOU MUST TAKE REQUIRED

## BC University - Second Language Requirements

> Although not a high school graduation requirement, most BC Universities require students applying directly from high school to have completed at least a Language 11 (ie; Spanish 11, Punjabi 11)
$>$ SFU will accept an Introductory Language 11 (ie; Intro Spanish 11)
$>$ UBC will ONLY accept a Language 11 or 12 (NOT Introductory 11)
$>$ However, some faculties require a Language 12 to Graduate from (ie; Faculty of Arts). If you do not have a Language 12, then you must complete a $1^{\text {st }}$ year language course (ie; spend $\$ \$$ on an extra course)

Some faculties at Uvic DO NOT have a second language requirement (ie; Engineering, Sciences, Business)
> If you are an ELL Student, and came to Burnaby South AFTER Grade 8, you "may" be eligible for a Language 11 and/or 12 Credit

If you think you may qualify, please check with your Counsellor
$>$ A requirement for American Universities/Colleges for entrance
> If you are thinking of attending school in the US, you MUST write the SAT's no later than the Spring of Grade $11 \rightarrow$ so THIS SPRING!!
$>$ LPI - Check out www.lpi.ubc.ca
> A language test required by UBC and SFU (and other universities) for those students with a final grade of less than $75 \%$ in BC English Studies 12 or BC Literary Studies 12
> Check the websites of all colleges and universities that you are applying to for updates on this requirement

## TOEFL

> BC Universities vary - generally NOT required for students with 4 years of instruction in English.
> Confirm with each University
> Other provinces \& USA - NOT required for students with 5 years of instruction in English.
> Confirm with each University

## Scholarships!!

$>$ It is NOT too early to start thinking about making some $\$ \$$ for Post-Secondary - many scholarships out there are available for student's who may currently be in Grade 11!!
> Mr. Kwan - located in the career prep centre in student services - c105
> Is the "guru" "go To guy" "ceo" (aka: contact person) for all things scholarships related
> All scholarships available with only be placed on the counselling/scholarship blog as they become available: blogs.sd41.bc.ca/south-counselling/scholarships/
> There will be a different tab for each month scholarships are due
> Note: Make sure you check the "tab" regularly, as some scholarships may have a very short window before the deadline
> The following places are also very helpful to learn about new scholarships:

$>$ Hallway Monitors $>$ Your own job - honestly!
> Memo board in front of C105 (STUDENT SERVICES)
> FYI....MILLIONS OF SCHOLARSHIPS GO UNCLAIMED EACH YEAR BECAUSE STUDENTS DO NOT APPLY FOR THEM $\rightarrow$ DON'T BE ONE OF THOSE!

## TALK TO YOUR CURRENT TEACHERS

> Ask your current Teachers about what future courses are all about
> English, Math, Science \& Social Studies
> Talk to your current teachers to learn more info about what Grade 11 \& 12 classes are:
> English 11 Focuses: Composition vs. Creative Writing vs. First Peoples vs. Literary Studies vs. Literary Studies Honours vs. New Media vs. Spoken Language
> English 12 Focuses: English Studies 12 vs. English First Peoples 12 vs. AP English Literature \& Composition 12
> Math 11 Streams: Pre-Calculus 11 vs. Foundations 11 vs. Workplace 11
> Remember...Pre-Calculus is ONLY needed for Business \& Sciences in Univ.
$\rightarrow$ You can take Foundations 11 \& 12 if you are applying to Faculty of Arts in Univ.
$>$ Math 12 Streams: Pre-Calculus 12 vs. Foundations 12 vs. Calculus 12
> Check your Post-Secondary Requirements NOW!!
> Some Universities require Pre-Calculus 12 AND Calculus 12
ALSO! You cannot take Foundations 11 and then choose Pre-Calculus 12
> If you are currently taking Found 11 and want to take Pre-Calc 12 in Sept then you MUST enroll in Summer School for Pre-Calc 11

## Tips for Grade 12 Course Selection

## * TALK TO YOUR CURRENT TEACHERS

> Science 11 Streams: Chemistry vs. Earth Sciences vs. Life Sciences vs. Physics
> Remember...Physics 11 \& Chemistry 11 is needed for applying to Sciences in University $\rightarrow$ Engineering also requires Chemistry 12 \& Physics 12
> To Apply for Faculty of Arts in Univ, you can take Life Sciences or Earth Science
> Science 12 Streams: Chemistry vs. Geology vs. Life Sciences vs. Physics
$>$ REMEMBER...You cannot take Anatomy \& Physiology 12, Chemistry 12, or Physics 12 WITHOUT taking Life Sciences 11, Chem 11 or Phys 11 FIRST!!
> You MUST enroll in Summer School for any Grade 11 Science classes that you are currently missing if you want to take the Grade 12 version
> Social Studies 11/12 Focuses: SS 11 Explorations vs. 20th Century World History vs. BC First Peoples vs. Human Geography vs. Physical Geography vs. Law Studies vs. Social Justice

Remember...These Teachers are your "experts" on these courses, because they are the ones teaching them!

## Tips for Grade 11 \& 12 Course Selection

## * SUMMER SCHOOL

> Students going into Grade 11 \& 12 CAN take Summer School courses if they would like to "advance" or "preview" the next years courses
$>$ IF...you are "previewing" the Grade 11 or 12 course, then you are NOT going to receive credit for the course, and you will have to take the course in September
> If...you are "advancing" the Grade 11 or 12 course, then you ARE receiving credit for that course, and will NOT be taking it in September
> IF...you are planning on taking a Summer School course to "advance" then you must select the next course you are wanting to take here on your Student MyEd Portal

## Tips for Grade 11 \& 12 Course Selection

## SUMMER SCHOOL

> NOTE: You CANNOT take a course in Summer School to "advance" to then take the AP/Honours Course in September
> le: taking Chem 11 in Summer in hopes of going into AP Chemistry
> Summer School info will become available end of April early May
> As soon as we have the information, it will be up in the school

## * BURNABY ONLINE SUMMER SCHOOL

> Students CAN take "some" courses Online through Burnaby Online
> le: Career Life Education 10 - if you did not take it THIS year
> FYI...Online Classes are VERY different than in school classes
> le: You teach YOURSELF the course - your Online Teacher can answer questions through email, NOT teach you course material
