WELCOME STUDENTS OF THE CLASS OF 2024

- > Your Course Selection Sheet is a contract between YOU & Burnaby South
- ➤ All schools are staffed and timetabled based on how <u>YOU</u> complete <u>YOUR</u>

 Course Selection right <u>NOW</u>
- > Only those courses with a *sufficient* number of students registered (by April 2021) will be able to be offered and run for September 2021
 - > Class that have too few students who selected them will have to be cancelled for the 2021-22 school year
 - This may occur after Course Verification Sheets are sent out in May, so it's very important to have alternate choices for your electives "just in case"

- ➤ Sometimes it is <u>NOT</u> possible for us to give you your 1st Choices → usually in your electives (*ie*; not in Math or Science courses)
 - > That's why we need to know what else you might want to take
 - > By picking an "alternate" the computer knows what other courses you are interested in to try and fit in your timetable
 - YES, there is always a possibility an alternate course will be in your timetable, so.....pick WISELY!!
 - ➤ If you pick the course (regular or alternate), and you get it in your timetable, you will be required to stay in it
 - > NOTE: It will NOT be a Timetable Error in September

- > ALL Burnaby South Students are required to take 8 Courses INSIDE the Timetable
- > ONLY Students with *incomplete* Timetables or *legitimate* errors will be approved for a Course *Correction* in September 2021
 - ➤ Legitimate Errors For Example Are:
 - > You have already completed the course you are enrolled in
 - > ie: you completed a course in Summer School (Social Studies 10)
 - > You require the course for University Admissions
 - > ie: Pre-Calculus 11 or Chemistry 11

- ➤ What is <u>NOT</u> considered a Legitimate Error?
 - > Not "liking" your course you're enrolled in
 - > Not having any friends in your class
 - > Not liking the time of day the class is in your timetable
 - > You want to have a specific teacher
 - > You change your mind
- > MAKE YOUR CHOICES CAREFULLY!!
 - > Remember: There will be NO Course Changes in September

What Are Honours Courses?

- > Honours courses are offered in Grades 8 to 11
- > Benefits of Honours courses:
 - Intended for advanced and motivated students who wish to study in an enriched learning environment
 - Study a subject at a greater depth with equally interested students
 - ❖ Find out what you can really do → challenge yourself
 - Honours Courses prepare students for AP Courses

What Are AP Courses?

- > AP Stands for Advanced Placement
- AP Courses are University Level Courses and Exams offered at the High School Level
 - * We teach the University-level courses here
 - Students write the end-of course AP Exam externally developed & scored by university & AP teachers
 - Exams are scored on a scale of 1 to 5
 - Advanced Standing granted at Canadian Universities for those who score a 4 or 5 on the AP Exam
 - Some American Universities will give advanced standing for a score of 3

What Are AP Courses?

- > Benefits of AP Courses and the AP Exam:
 - Stand out in your post-secondary admissions applications
 - Recognized by universities in more than 60 countries for admission
 - Earn post-secondary education course credit
 - Build and learn post-secondary skills while still in high school

Reminder... How to Apply for Honours Courses

- >Minimum Requirements:
 - > Subject minimum percentage is an A/B
 - > Work Habit should be GOOD in the subject area
- Select ALL of the AP/Honours Courses you want to apply for in your MyEd Student Portal
 - > VERY IMPORTANT: You MUST choose your AP/Honours Courses NOW
 - ➤ It is <u>TOO LATE</u> to apply for an AP/Honours Course during Course Verifications in the Spring

How to Apply for Honours Courses

- >CHANGES FOR THIS YEAR!!
 - ➤ English, Math & Social Studies Honours
 - ➤ An Entrance Exam will occur in Quarter 4 for those students who apply for these courses
 - NOTE: Grade 11 & 12 Honours Classes there are no changes in applying, you will still select the Honours/AP Course(s) that you want to apply for on the Student MyEd Portal (Feb 8-15th)
- For students selecting Grade 11 Honours Courses (ie; you've already completed Sci 9/10 Hon), or selecting any AP Course(s) (ie: AP Computer Science Principles, AP Human Geography, AP Microeconomics, AP Music Theory, AP Physics 1, AP Statistics) admission is based on Term 1 & 2 Grades + Work Habits

How to Apply for Honours Courses

- ➤ After Course Selections are completed (and any Honours Exams are written), Teachers in each Department will discuss who should be placed into each of the Honours/AP classes
 - > Students who do *NOT* get placed into an Honours/AP class will be placed onto a Waitlist for September

Technology Academy (1 year at Cariboo Hill)

- > Are you interested in gaining a leading edge in the Technology field?
 - Burnaby has partnered with Technology Leaders to offer a specialized academy
 - Students interested will attend Cariboo Hill for 1yr (completing BOTH Academic Courses & Technology Courses)
 - > Students can then return to Burnaby South for Grade 11
- > There are 2 Programs open for Grade 10 Students:
 - Digipen Game Development Academy
 - DigiPen provides students with an opportunity to participate in the curriculum of a recognized video game university (DigiPen)
 - > Video Game Programming Level 1 & 2: 2D Video Games & Game Engine
 - > Students will learn the foundational programming concepts that form the basis of games and other programs
 - > students will focus on understanding the crucial computer science, computer graphics, and mathematical concepts of how 2D game engines are created
 - Microsoft Office Specialist Certification
 - Receive globally recognized Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) Certification

Palo Alto Cyber Security Academy at Cariboo Hill

Robotics (Mechatronics) at Alpha Secondary

- 16 credits
- Focus on programming specific to automation, hardware control & manufacturing industries
- Students build industry connections through work experience placements



Volleyball & Lacrosse Academy

- > Are you interested in training in Volleyball or Lacrosse while taking High School Classes?
 - Burnaby has partnered with SFU Athletics & Volleyball Canada to offer 2 specialized Academies to our Burnaby Students
 - > Students interested in an Athletic Academy will attend 2 classes offsite, where they will receive classes consisting of skill development, weight training and nutritional and mental preparation
- > There are 2 Different Programs open for Grade 10 Students:
 - > Volleyball Academy
 - > Training by Nationally appointed Coaching Staff
 - > Students can choose from 2 pathways: Academy Stream or Elite Stream
 - > Students participate for 2-3 sessions/week (1.5/2hrs per session) at Cariboo Hill for 36 weeks
 - > Students receive credit for PE and a sport specific course
 - > FEE: \$235/month for 10 Months (\$2350 for the year)

> Lacrosse Academy

- Supervised by SFU Lacrosse Head Coach
- > Students attend 2 lacrosse classes every other day in the morning based on a two-week class rotation schedule (Week 1: Tue/Thurs and Week 2: Mon/Wed/Fri) at SFU Burnaby Campus
- > Students receive credit for PE and a sport specific course
- > FEE: \$235/month for 10 Months (\$2350 for the year)



Post-Secondary Timeline Tips

- 1. STAGE 1: EARLY YEARS Early Financial Planning
 - ✓ A 4-year degree can cost up to \$70,000 in the US, you can multiply that by 4x
 - ✓ Look at saving for Post-Secondary start up a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA) for the educational costs you will be facing after High School


2. STAGE 2: GRADES 8 - 10 - Academic Awareness

- ✓ Career Life Education 10 Course
 - You will start exploring your interests, career options & post-secondary
- ✓ Start having conversations with your parents about specific courses you may want to take in Grade 10
 - Are you wanting to try an Honours Course?
 - Post-Secondary Institutions are beginning to look at "rigor" of course work for admissions
- ✓ Be aware of Grades
 - Universities are beginning to move away from simply looking at JUST grades, and looking at a students entire transcript

Tips for Grade 10 Course Selection

*** TALK TO YOUR CURRENT TEACHERS**

- > Ask your current Teachers about what future courses are all about
- > English & Math 10
 - Talk to your current teachers to find out more information about what these Grade 10 classes are:
 - > Ie: Math: Foundations & Pre-Calculus 10 vs. Math: Workplace 10
 - Ie: English 10 Focuses (Composition Honours vs. Creative Writing vs. First Peoples vs. New Media vs. Spoken Language)
- Note: These Teachers are your "experts" on these courses, because they are the ones teaching them!

Tips for Grade 10 Course Selection

❖ SUMMER SCHOOL

- > Students going into Grade 10 <u>CAN</u> take Summer School courses if they would like to "advance" or "preview" the next years courses
 - ▶ IF...you are "previewing" the Grade 10 course, then you are NOT going to receive credit for the course, and you will have to take the course in September
 - If...you are "advancing" the Grade 10 course, then you <u>ARE</u> receiving credit for that course, and will <u>NOT</u> be taking it in September
 - ➤ IF...you are planning on taking a Summer School course to "advance" then you must select the next course you are wanting to take here on your Student MyEd Portal

Tips for Grade 10 Course Selection

SUMMER SCHOOL

- ➤ NOTE: You <u>CANNOT</u> take a course in Summer School to "advance" to then take the Honours Course in September
 - ▶ Ie: taking Science 10 in Summer in hopes of going into Chemistry 11 Honours, Life Sciences 11 Honours, AP Physics 1 Honours
- > Summer School info will become available end of April early May
 - > As soon as we have the information, it will be up in the school

*** BURNABY ONLINE SUMMER SCHOOL**

- > Students CAN take "some" courses Online through Burnaby Online
 - > le: Career Life Education 10
- > FYI...Online Classes are <u>VERY</u> different than in school classes
 - ➤ Ie: You teach YOURSELF the course your Online Teacher can answer questions through email, NOT teach you course material

 - You have a DIFFERENT Course Selection Form & will be completing it on paper and handing in to your Counsellor in Student Services
 - > Grade 9's
 - ➢ February 15th at 11:59pm
 - Course Selection will be completed <u>ONLINE</u> this year again through your MyEd Student Portal
 - ➤ Students who have NEVER logged in to their MyEd Student Portal will receive their Login information on their Course Selection form & will be able to enter their Courses into their MyEd Student Portal until *Monday*, *February 15th at 11:59pm*


