- Reflect on learning experiences
- Celebration of learning and accomplishments

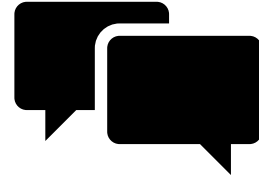

Hints

- Your presentation will be note /cue card free
- Write your script out fully and memorize it
- Do a few practice runs with someone
 - This will give you a good indication of how long your presentation will be.
 - Should be 8–9 minutes.
(1-5 minutes for Q & A / comments)

2. What to
Say During your
presentation



Talk about the Following:

1. Introduce yourself and who you are
2. Talk about how your career path/passion lead you to your Grad Project idea
3. Present your project and what you accomplished over the past 6-8 months. **Talk us through the project PROCESS from the beginning to the end.**

Talk about the Following:

4. Mentorship experience
5. Reflect on your challenges and successes.
This is an important component of the presentation.
6. Present artifacts of learning (minimum of 4 artifacts/evidence)
7. Thoughtful life/plans after high - school.

What ARE ARTIFACTS/EVIDENCE

- Artifacts are documents/objects that are related to the project
- The artifacts you bring should reflect your project progress (timeline) and/or achievements
- Should be presented throughout the presentation
- Should speak to the artifacts, not just show us

What ARE ARTIFACTS/EVIDENCE

- Some examples:
 - Digital/printed designs such as CAD/Drafting/Fashion
 - App software
 - Digital/tangible art pieces
 - 3D models
 - Photos
 - Videos of you working on something
 - Research notes, reports
 - Business Plans
 - Drafts of your work

Photo/VIDEO EVIDENCE

- Photos of evidence/artifacts should be your OWN original photos (not just photos taken from the internet).
- Aim to have photos that also include yourself (e.g. selfies of you engaging in the process)
- This helps us to verify your participation in the project.

3. Dress for success



Business Casual

- A classic, clean cut, and put together look where a full suit is not required
- Groomed hair

Examples:

- dress shirt/blouse
- blazer
- trousers/dress pants/khakis/skirt
- dress shoes/ flats/ heels

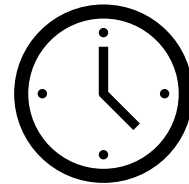

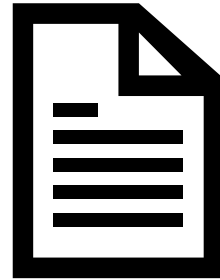
- Sanitize your hands upon arrival and departure

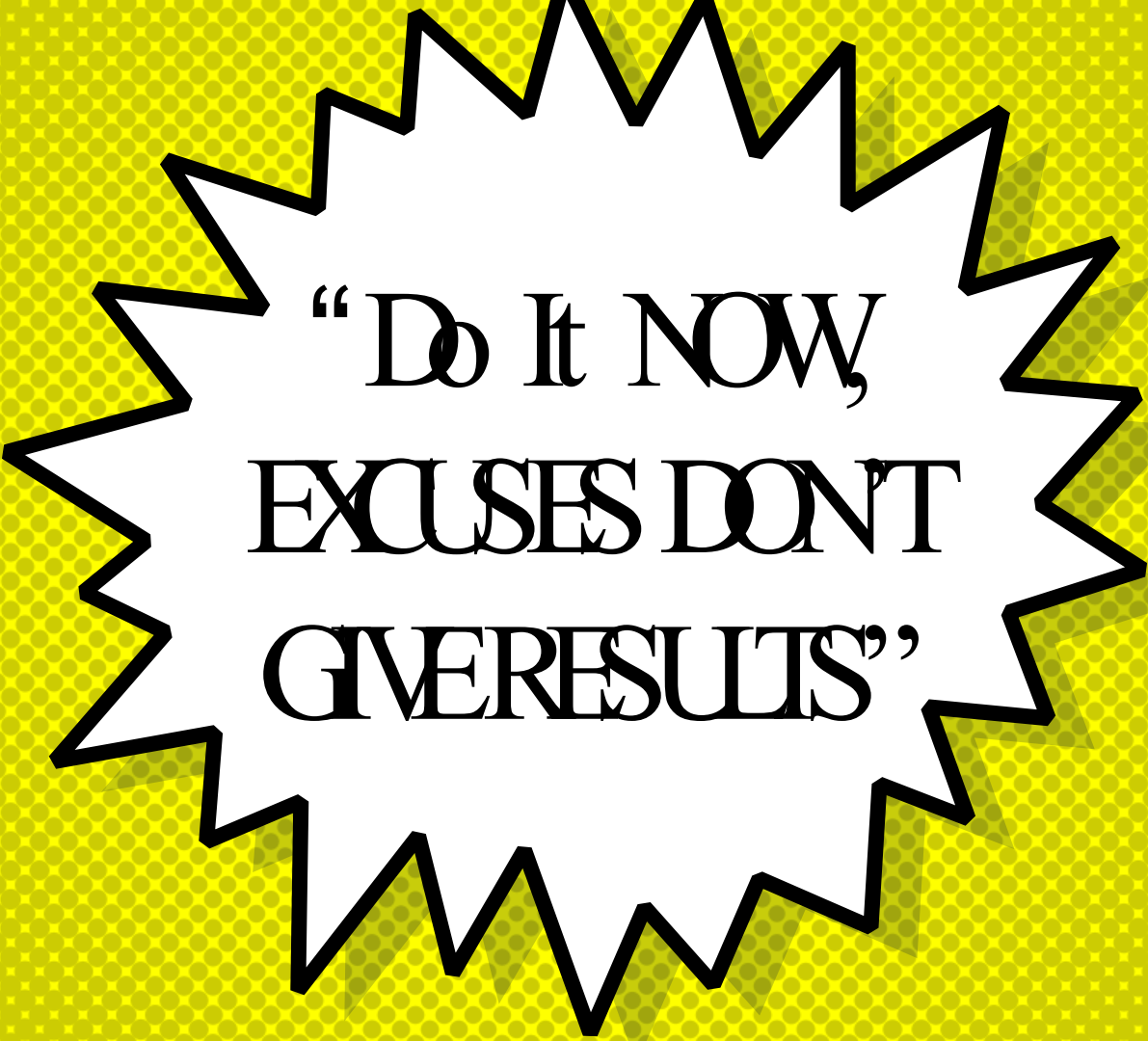
