Content Library

In the content library, you post your lecture notes and assignment information in a view-only format. Students can read and copy pages from the content library into their own notebooks, but cannot make changes to the pages in the content library.

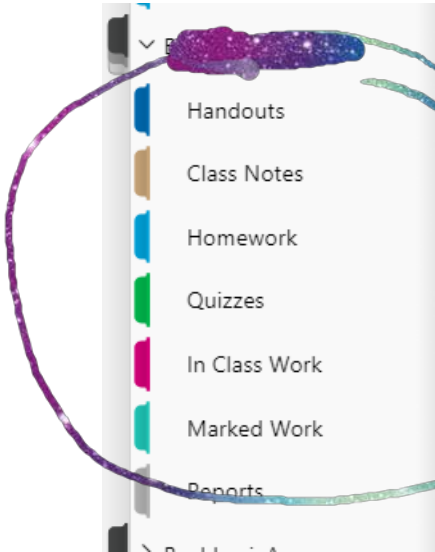

Both the student and the teacher can edit pages within all of these sections. Student notebooks are semi-private in that only the assigned student and the teacher can see content in their notebook. Other students cannot view content in other students' notebooks.

Sections of student notebooks

The teacher can annotate student work and provide assessment information by typing directly onto student notebook pages, or, as in the example, drawing on a tablet. Teachers can also leave audio or video feedback on student work pages using the "Insert" tab and "Record Audio" or "Record Video" options (Desktop Version).

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1. The government pays for its programs by collecting taxes. For example income taxes, and taxes such as the HST.
