## **OUR EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY**

Burnaby Central provides students an opportunity to experience an array of academic, athletic, art and applied skills courses. We encourage students to try a variety of elective courses during their years at Central. Future employers and universities are looking for students who have well-rounded learning experiences.

As such, student choice is an important part of how we organize our school year. Counsellors and teachers have taken steps to make sure Central students are aware of their learning choices.

We staff our school based on student choice; therefore, we believe that students and their parents/guardians should take some time to discuss course options. Students who have well balanced, and diverse, choices will have no need to drop courses as the year progresses. Students choosing courses only to drop them later can also cause a course to be closed and the opportunity to try something new will be lost for everyone. We ask that parents/guardians and students carefully consider the course selections before signing the form.

## Please keep in mind:

- Students at Burnaby Central are expected to be enrolled in full-time studies, 4
  classes each semester, during the school day, for a total of 8 classes. The only
  exceptions are students who have applied and been accepted to our AVPA
  program and Grade 12 students who have applied for and been granted a study
  block.
- Students who are taking on-line courses are not eligible for study blocks or spares.
- Students in grades 8-10 taking courses outside the timetable (Choir, Jazz Band, and First Aid) are not eligible for study blocks or spares.
- It is not recommended that students take 8 academic courses in one school year. If a student has chosen 8 academic courses, the counsellors will be contacting parents/guardians to discuss other elective options.
